

# CAMPUS GRADUATE PROGRAM FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

# **APPLICATION PROCESS:**

Is an undergraduate or graduate degree in criminology or criminal justice required? No, it is not required that you have a background in criminology and criminal justice. We have many students from related fields such as psychology, sociology, political science, etc. apply to our program.

# How do I apply to the graduate program?

Visit the <u>admissions website</u> to apply. Please note all applications are to be submitted electronically (no paper applications are available).

# Which semesters can I apply to your program?

We admit students to the master's and doctoral campus degrees in the fall and spring semesters.

# What are the deadline dates to apply?

The graduate degree admission deadlines are as follows:

- Fall July 1
  Please note if you are a prospective doctoral student and wish to be considered for a departmental assistantship, your completed application must be received by Jan. 15 prior to the fall semester in which you are applying.
- Spring Nov. 1

#### **GRE REQUIREMENTS:**

#### Can the GRE requirement be waived?

No, the University requires that a GRE score be submitted. The GRE cannot be waived. We will accept a GMAT or an LSAT for the master's degree program only. All students are required to have a GRE score for the Ph.D. If you originally apply to the master's degree program with a different exam, you will need to submit a GRE score if you choose to later continue on to the Ph.D. program.

#### Which GRE should I take?

We require the general graduate record examination.

# What is Florida State University's GRE code?

To report your GRE scores to Florida State University, please select code number 5219 when taking the exam.

# Is there a required GRE score?

Our students typically score between 148 and 160 on each of the verbal and quantitative portions of the GRE.

# **GPA REQUIREMENTS:**

# What are the GPA requirements for graduate study?

The minimum GPA requirement for the master's degree is a 3.25 undergraduate GPA in your last two years of undergraduate study. If you are applying to the doctoral program with a master's degree, a minimum graduate GPA of 3.5 is also required. Students are eligible to apply directly from the bachelor's degree to the doctoral program provided their undergraduate GPA minimum is 3.5.

# How can I establish Florida residency?

For information on establishing Florida residency, please check the <u>admissions website</u> and you may also consult with a residency advisor in the registrar's office.

# If I am already a Florida resident, do I still need to establish residency?

Yes, you will still need to establish Florida residency by completing the <u>online residency</u> <u>form</u>. You will need to complete this form even if you were a Florida resident as an undergraduate student at Florida State.

# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

#### Are scholarships available?

Yes, the department has scholarships available for graduate students. You may check our website for scholarship opportunities for graduate students.

# Are assistantships available?

If you are applying to our doctoral program, you are eligible to be considered for an assistantship as long as your application is completed and submitted by Jan. 15. Assistantships are very competitive and not all new Ph.D. students receive assistantships, as there are only a limited number of assistantships available each year. Students awarded an assistantship will work directly with a faculty member as a teaching and/or research assistant, receive a stipend and tuition waivers. If you are applying directly to the doctoral degree program from the bachelor's degree, you can be considered for funding. We do not have assistantship opportunities for master's students.

# Are fellowships available?

#### TRANSFER INFORMATION:

# Can I transfer graduate credit hours in to the graduate program in criminology at Florida State University?

Students may transfer in up to 6 credit hours. These courses will be evaluated by the registrar's office and a grade of "B" or better must have been earned in any courses reviewed for transfer credit. Contact the graduate program office to initiate this process after you have enrolled as a student.

# How do I apply for graduation?

All students must apply for graduation online via <u>my.fsu.edu</u> in order to receive their degree.

# When should I apply for graduation?

You will typically apply for graduation within the first two weeks of the semester in which you plan to graduate. Specific dates are published on the <u>Registrar website</u> or can be obtained by calling 644-5850.

# Are there any fees associated with an application for graduation?

No, there aren't any fees associated with applying for graduation.
