# Graduate Admissions Checklist

## Combined Bachelor's of Science to Master's of Science Program

The Combined Bachelor's-Master's Degree Program provides academically talented students the opportunity\* to complete both degrees in a reduced time frame. The program enables undergraduates to count up to 12 credit hours (at the 5000 level and above) toward both the BS and MS degrees.

**To be eligible for the BS-MS program,** applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be a current FSU student
- Have completed 90 hours of coursework
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.25

\*Formal Application to Graduate Program: Dual enrollment students must still be officially accepted into the graduate program by submitting a formal application. This application should be completed during the last semester of one's senior year.

### **To enroll in the program, complete the following procedures.**

- Meet with a College advisor who will determine your eligibility.
- Obtain a "Request to Take Graduate Courses as an Undergraduate" form from the Registrar's Office.
- Take the form to the College graduate advisor, Margarita Frankeberger, to determine the appropriate course(s) to take.
- Obtain all required signatures on the form.
- Return the form to the Registrar's Office to be placed in the course(s) during the proper registration window.
