Graduate Admissions Checklist

Combined Bachelor's of Science to Master's of Science Program

The Combined Bachelor's-Master's Degree Program provides academically talented students the opportunity* to complete both degrees in a reduced time frame. The program enables undergraduates to count up to 12 credit hours (at the 5000 level and above) toward both the BS and MS degrees.

To be eligible for the BS-MS program, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be a current FSU student
- Have completed 90 hours of coursework
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.25

*Formal Application to Graduate Program: Dual enrollment students must still be officially accepted into the graduate program by submitting a formal application. This application should be completed during the last semester of one's senior year.

To enroll in the program, complete the following procedures.

- Meet with a College advisor who will determine your eligibility.
- Obtain a "Request to Take Graduate Courses as an Undergraduate" form from the Registrar's Office.
- Take the form to the College graduate advisor,
 Margarita Frankeberger, to determine the appropriate course(s) to take.
- Obtain all required signatures on the form.
- Return the form to the Registrar's Office to be placed in the course(s) during the proper registration window.
